**A Pandemic is Worldwide** by Sarah L. Thomson & Taia Morley (4-8).

Pandemics explained for our younger readers, as well as a survey of historical events and medical breakthroughs. **Nonfiction.**

**Maria and the Plague: A Black Death Survival Story (Girls Survive)** by Francesca Ficorilli (8-12).

A twelve-year-old struggles for survival as the plague consumes her community in 14th century Florence, Italy. **Fiction.**

**History Smashers: Plagues and Pandemics** by Kate Messner and Falynn Koch (8-12).

A survey of deadly diseases from Black Death to COVID-19, offering historical context through sidebars and images. **Nonfiction.**

**Wild Bird** by Diane Zahler (8-12).

Rype is the sole survivor when the plague devastates her Norwegian village, but she seeks safety with travelers as they make their way to England. **Fiction.**

**Science Comics: Plagues: The Microscopic Battlefield** by Falynn Koch (8+).

A graphic novel introduction to deadly diseases and medical efforts to combat them. **Nonfiction.**

**Bubonic Panic: When Plague Invaded America (Deadly Diseases)** by Gail Jarrow (10-14).

The appearance of bubonic plague set public health officials scrambling in 1900 San Francisco in this gripping, well-researched account of the crisis. **Nonfiction.**

**Fever 1793** by Laurie Halse Anderson (10-14).

As yellow fever sweeps through Philadelphia, a teen who flees the city must use all her resources to survive. **Fiction.**

**A Cloud of Outrageous Blue** by Vesper Stamper (12+).

After her parents' deaths, artistic Edyth, who has synesthesia, moves to a priory to work on ancient texts, while the Great Plague approaches in this heavily illustrated novel. **Fiction.**
